

Program 'Fair-Travel' in Tanzania

Provisional travel date:

17th – 24th of July 2011

2nd – 9th of November 2011



Itinerary

Arrival to Arusha – overnight stay at a hotel in Arusha.

Day 1 After breakfast we leave for **Tarangire National Park** – game drive – and then continue to Karatu village where we stay at the Kudu lodge.



Day 2 Day trip to **Lake Eyasi**
We meet with the **Hadzabe** bush people, the last Tanzanian hunter- and gatherer tribe, and with people of the **Tatoga** tribe.
Back to Karatu and Kudu lodge.

Day 3 After breakfast we leave for the unparalleled jewel of this area, the 16 x 20 km sized and world famous **Ngorongoro crater**, the largest caldera in the world that is not filled with water.
With a bit of luck we may sight the „Big Five“ among African animals: lion, leopard, buffalo, elephant, and rhino.



In the late afternoon we continue to the Endulen hostel for the night.
This hostel is part of the Endulen hospital.

Day 4 After breakfast we drive along the **Serengeti National Park** to **Wasso** where we stay at the guest house of the Wasso hospital.

**Days
5 – 6**

We spend two days with our Maasai friends in Wasso.

Emmanuel invites us to his **Maasai boma**.

He very much likes to talk about the culture of his tribe, how they live, the importance of rituals, about the use of medical plants, etc.

Hikes to **Wasso mountain** and surrounding area.

Claude Rieser – he lives in Wasso since May 2008 and acts as administrator and consultant – will show us the **hospital** and give some inside information on the cooperation with Government and catholic church as owner of the hospital, working conditions, etc.).

Day 7 Departure to Sonjo and **lake Natron**, the only reproduction area of **flamingos** in the Rift Valley. Hike to **beautiful water** falls.

Overnight in a luxury tented camp.



Day 8 Drive back to **Arusha** with close looks on **Oi Doinyo Lengai**, the Holy Mountain of Maasai people. Presentation of a Maasai women project. Last 'get together' in Arusha.
